This Spring has been a very busy one for me personally and it has been hard to concentrate on New York North.

I attended NERD (North East Regional Delegates) in March with Molly and met with all the new and returning Delegates from the North East States. It gave me a chance to interact with them and to learn from them. We explored thoughts on:

How Areas work with groups who do not follow the Traditions and what we do to work with them before they are removed from our Schedules. I do not know if this is a problem here in New York North but I thought that if it is, I do hope the District Representatives will feel free to contact either the Current or a Former Delegate to work with them to help these groups before it become necessary to remove them. Sometimes it's just a matter of miscommunication or lack of education where these problems arise. Let's work together to have Strong Groups.

There was also a workshop on Bias. I thought I knew what Bias meant but the Presenter show me areas that I did not think of such as:

- A.** Don't assume that a Male Newcomer who comes to the door is looking for an AA Meeting and you direct them down the hall?
- B** Do I talk only to members I see every week and ignore everyone else before and after the meeting?
- C.** Do I criticize people who do not want to give Service to our meeting or at other levels without knowing their personal circumstances? (Maybe they have young children at home or an active Alcoholic who they can't leave children with. Maybe they have fears that I don't have).

This presentation made me think and I hope that it will help you to look at yourself and see if you have bias's that even though they are not intentional we still have and we would not want it to keep anyone

away from receiving the spiritual benefit that our Program has for them or us.

A skit was presented about the use of the Service Manual to find out information about how to run a meeting, who can be a GR, DR, Officer or Coordinator, what our responsibilities are, the Policies of Al-anon, how to use our three Legacies , (Steps, Traditions, & Concepts) to enhance our Recovery. After this was presented I knew that there was a lot more about the Service Manual I did not know about and I knew it was time to read it again. I encourage you to use it as well to answer questions that you might have regarding Al-Anon Service. If your Group does not have one contact your Area Service Center to purchase one (can also be ordered directly on the WSO website)

Again I will be leading the New Group Representatives Meeting at the Spring Assembly (early Saturday Morning). Please attend to meet other new GR's and to receive information that will help you to understand how Service works.




