I try to let go of the things which may be beyond my control, but to have faith that things will work out the way my Higher Power wants them to. Most of the expectations I may experience come from thinking that others should have the same values and commitments that I practice. Therefore, I need to remember that I am the only me on this earth. I am unique.

Dear NYN Friends,

The AWSC meeting was held on August 10th. The purpose was to set the agenda for the Fall Assembly which will be held on Saturday, September 21. I'm writing to give you all an idea of what is on the agenda for September.

The budget for NYN for next year 2020 will be presented and voted on. There are no big changes to next year's budget. Also, we will be discussing and voting on our yearly donation to WSO. Traditionally we have sent 10% of the proceeds from the Spring Assembly/Convention. In the past few years thinking we have been able to exceed that 10%.

We will be hearing more about Zoom and whether this is a program NYN wants to pursue. Alateen has been using this program for a while to hold committee interest meetings.

A large part of the assembly will be discussion and hopefully voting to approve the Alateen guidelines. They were presented at the Spring Assembly but voting was tabled until the fall. A number of points were brought up. Since then, those working on the guidelines have reviewed these points and some revisions were made.

The revised Alateen guidelines have been posted on the NYN website. It is important that you and other members of your group review these before the Assembly. I am really hoping that they can be approved this time. NYN has been working on these revisions for a long time.

There will be a few other items on the agenda. The agenda will be posted on the NYN website at least 2 weeks before the assembly.

This brings me to my final point. I want to remind all members that all officer and coordinator reports, the proposed budget and other items will be posted on the NYN website 2 weeks before the Assembly. For a number of years now we have asked members to visit the website and to download and make copies of these reports. If you have a tablet, laptop or a smart phone you can use that during the assembly to pull up those same reports. For those who cannot do this there will be a few copies for reports available (guidelines are 5 copies). The reports will also be projected on the wall while they are being given.

This month's theme is expectations. I know for me I have to stay away from expectations. If I don't, I get myself in trouble. My expectations are what I think should be said or done or felt. I cannot project my expectations on someone else. There was a time with one of the alcoholics in my life that I couldn't seem to detach, I couldn't let go and because of this I felt a lot of pain. I never liked what he was doing but it wasn't my business. I could not impose my expectations on him. I could set my boundaries for me and follow them. Things became better. Public Outreach

Hello NYN Family,

I am forwarding a message from Vali F., Executive Director at the World Service Office. Many have questions about members and prospective members that come to meetings because of a loved one dealing with drug addiction. Where is our focus?

We are all messengers of Al-Anon's purpose and have the responsibility to accurately communicate it to avoid confusion, misperception, or dilution of our program.

The 2018 Membership Survey states that 35% of members came to our program specifically because of someone's use of drugs. The survey also showed that 78% of these members eventually came to realize that someone else's drinking had also affected their lives.

When developing and implementing public outreach activities, members are urged to keep Al-Anon's Twelve Traditions in mind. This includes reviewing the words of the Traditions in their entirety. The following summary of applicable Traditions may assist your communication efforts with members, newcomers, professionals, and the media:

1. Tradition Three states that "the only requirement for [Al-Anon] membership is that there be a problem of alcoholism in a relative or friend."
2. Tradition Four tells us that "each group should be autonomous, except in

matters affecting another group or Al-Anon or AA as a whole."

3. Tradition Five clarifies that we have "but one purpose: to help families of alcoholics."
4. Tradition Ten tells us that "the Al-Anon Family Groups have no opinion on outside issues."

According to a statement on page 131 in Al-Anon's Conference-approved "Digest of Al-Anon and Alateen Policies," "Our responsibility is to ensure Al-Anon's survival as a resource for families and friends of alcoholics. By focusing on these drug-related problems, we risk being diverted from Al-Anon's primary aim."

Therefore, conveying that Al-Anon is for families and friends of alcoholics and drug addicts in local- or Area-produced public outreach materials is an expansion and misrepresentation of Al-Anon's purpose (see Tradition Five). This includes but is not limited to posters, flyers, websites, etc. *We appreciate your efforts to support the families and friends of alcoholics and maintain our Traditions and primary purpose.*

There have been a couple changes to this year's NYNAC (New York North Alateen Conference) event.

- Location change: We have moved from Vanderkamp (Cleveland, NY) to Casowasco (Moravia, NY). This was necessary due to the down payment at Vanderkamp exceeding our seed money.
- Proof of Insurance: Casowasco does not require us to produce a Certificate Of Insurance (per my discussion with Mike Huber, Program Director). The fact that NYN has insurance was all he needed to know.
- Date: Instead of the Columbus Day Weekend in October NYNAC will be September 13th, 14th and 15th this year. Columbus Day Weekend was not available at Casowasco.

- Linens are extra: Everyone must bring a set of sheets for a twin bed and a pillowcase. If you want linens from Casowasco, please bring \$9.00. I will need to let them know in advance.

The registration fee is \$154.00. This includes the price of the facilities we will be using, meals and one t-shirt per registrant. If anyone wants extra t-shirts or is not going and wants a t-shirt, the cost is \$8.00, which is what Action Printware is charging us for S – XL. Larger shirts are \$10.00. Please let me know if you are interested in a shirt or an extra shirt. The shirt order will be placed August 15th.

The registration fee does not cover hospitality. Each group is asked to please bring items for the hospitality table, and several left-over hospitality items were donated to NYNAC by the Spring Assembly. Stars of Hope is our hospitality group.

New Hope for Teens has the program section well under control, but there has been no "reveal" yet. I have been contacted by them and it looks like we may require some items for the "workshop" session, also not included in the registration fee. There's Always Tomorrow Alateen will help with this.

There's Always Tomorrow has the Creative section, will be making the Friday Night Fuzzies tonight (08/09/19).

Ithaca Keep It Simple has entertainment. I heard a rumor there will be a Karaoke machine.

I will be going to Casowasco for one last site visit on August 23rd. We will be discussing set up in our main lodge and assuring everything will be there for us when we arrive. This entire experience with Casowasco has been wonderful. Registration begins at 4pm. Please get in touch with me if you can come early and help set up.






