Warm Winter Greetings to the NYN Family and Friends!

I am feeling very new to my role as Chairperson of New York North. I am excited and ready to learn what the position entails. So far I have been reading our policies, bylaws, job descriptions, Area World Service Committee (AWSC) and Assembly guidelines, insurance information and much more.

As the incoming trusted servants, we are considered to be "Panel 64," which corresponds to the year we start our 3-year term. (The World Service Conference first met in April 1961. The officers, coordinators and delegates elected in 1961 were Panel 1.) A panel is one third of the Area delegates. The elections in the various Assembly Areas are staggered so that each year's World Service Conference always includes one panel of delegates with two years' experience. NYN also chooses to elect all officer and coordinator positions in the same starting year as our delegate, for a three-year term. (Some Areas also stagger their election of service positions.) World Service Conference Delegate Message & Request for Feedback

Happy New Year to all and Happy New Panel to all of our Officers and Coordinators.

I remember at the start of Panel 61 feeling overwhelmed by all the responsibilities that were now mine as the new Chairperson. I wasn't sure what to do first and I felt a bit intimidated. Now as I look back, I understand how the process works. I know now, as a new Delegate to the World Service Conference (WSC), that I just need to have faith and be patient with myself; I am learning and I have the support and guidance of the Al-Anon program and the people who have come before me. I just need to remember to "assume good will" and "ask for help" when I need it.

Thank you to everyone who participated in the Service Manual Review. Having others with whom I could discuss the material and ask and answer questions helped prepare me for my new position as Delegate. It was especially useful when the first thing I had to do as Delegate was to indicate my preferences for committee and task force assignments. I have been assigned to the Conference Committee on Trustees (CCT). See pages 174 and 210 of the service manual for more information: Al-Anon Alateen Service Manual (P-24/27) - Al-Anon Family Groups. I plan to read Concept 9 in more depth to get ready for this assignment.

My first order of business is to ask for **feedback** from the groups about the WSC visiting Stepping Stones. Stepping Stones is the historic home of Bill and Lois Wilson and an archive for the 12 Step Program. Here is link to the website: Landing Page - Stepping Stones Foundation - The Historic Home of Bill and Lois Wilson. The World Service Conference (WSC) is held near Stepping Stones once every three years so that delegates have the chance to visit once in their service tenure. The other 2 years the WSC is held in Virginia Beach, VA near the World Service Office (WSO). The cost of holding the WSC near Stepping Stones is considerably more than VA. The task force working on this issue would like us (the Delegates) to get feedback from our groups. Please consider taking these questions back to your

groups and having a group conscience discussion in order to provide me with feedback. Answers can be emailed to me at: Delegate@nynafg.com. Here are the questions:

- Do the groups in your Area believe it is important for their Delegate to visit Stepping Stones?
- *If yes, how do they see it helping their Area?*

As your Delegate I will be attending the Northeast Region Delegates (NERD) meeting in Massachusetts March 8-9, and the World Service Conference (WSC) in Virginia April 18-21. I look forward to presenting a report to you at the Spring Assembly in May.

You Can Easily Help Public Outreach

2024 Greetings to my fellow Al-Anon Trusted Servants and Members,

Maria S. here, transitioning from Archives Coordinator to Public Outreach Coordinator. I look forward to assisting our NYN groups and districts in helping our alcoholics and their families by "getting the word out" to professionals, to the media, to treatment facilities, hospitals, psychiatric wards, crisis/abuse shelters, as well as the general public.

One simple but powerful action that groups or individuals can take is purchase a pamphlet holder (under \$5), add 20 pamphlets (such as "A Guide for the Family of the Alcoholic" (P-7) (\$.35 ea.) and request permission to leave it in a doctor's office, library, hospital, etc. When the last pamphlet is gone, it is helpful to have a small index card with the local Al-Anon information taped to the holder so that people in need can still get information until the holder is stocked again.

Al-Anon's Co-founder, Lois W., was born on 3/4/1891—consider honoring her with Outreach action during her birthday month of March.

Convention Coordinator Explains Upcoming Gatherings

Happy New Year to the Al-Anon and Alateen members of New York North and to the incoming Panel 64 Officers and Coordinators!

The **2024 New York North Area Spring Assembly Meeting**, will be held on Saturday, May 11th, starting at 9 AM, and running (with breaks and an hour off for lunch into the afternoon) no later than 4 p.m. It will be held completely virtually, on Zoom. During this meeting our Delegate, Carol C. will give her report from the 2024 World Service Conference and Group Representatives will hear reports from the Area Officers and Coordinators and hold discussion and voting on any items on the agenda. The Assembly will be preceded by an AWSC meeting at 7 p.m. the evening of May 10th, on Zoom.

The 2024 New York North Area Fall Assembly will be held in a Hybrid format with an in-person Assembly (one day, possibly in Fayetteville, NY), with other attendees joining on Zoom. District 29 has offered to coordinate a virtual Sunday Morning Spiritual Panel of speakers for this 2024 Hybrid Fall Assembly. Since 2020, some of our virtual assemblies on Zoom have had both a virtual AWSC Meeting on Friday evening, followed by a virtual Ice Breaker event for all members and a virtual Spiritual panel on Sunday morning.

Looking forward to 2025, the 2025 New York North Area Spring Convention will be held as an in-person-only event which will include a program of workshops and panels for all Al-Anon, Alateen, and AA members attending. There will also be a short NYN Assembly Meeting for part of the day on Saturday and our Delegate, Carol C. will give her report from the 2025 World Service Conference. As presented at the 2023 NYN Fall Election Assembly, the 2025 Spring Convention would be planned to be heavy on Al-Anon program events and light on Al-Anon business. This type of event is normally held at a hotel which has banquet, rooming, and meeting facilities. There will be a need for a Host District, or Districts to work on putting on the 2025 NYN Spring Convention and Assembly. We will need to select a host District or Districts for the 2025 Spring Convention at the upcoming May 2024 NYN Virtual Spring Assembly in order for the Host Districts to have enough time to locate and book a hotel and plan and execute their program and other in-person events.

At any in-person Assembly or Convention, there is usually a New Group Representative (GR)

workshop and a New District Representative (DR) workshop and there will be panels and workshops for Al-Anon, Alateen and AA members on Friday and during the day on Saturday. There will also be a Hospitality Room as well as Raffle Items and Baskets to be won, and Al-Anon and Alateen Conference Approved Literature available for sale.

At our Spring Conventions, the NYN Area Delegate gives their report from the Annual Al-Anon World Service Conference at some point on Saturday. There will be no other workshops during the Delegate's Report. A small Al-Anon business meeting of 2 hours maximum duration may also be held along with tabling displays for the Coordinators of NYN, such as Alateen, Area Alateen Process Person, Archives, Convention, E-Meeting Host, Group Records, Literature Coordinator, Newsletter Editor, NYNAC Coordinator, Presentation Coordinator, Public Outreach Coordinator, and Webpage Coordinator.

On Saturday evening of an in-person Convention or an in-person Fall Assembly, there is usually a banquet followed by an Al-Anon Speaker, possibly someone from the speaker's circuit or the WSO. Past Conventions and Assemblies have also held a fun event after the Speaker such as a dance, talent show, slumber party, baby pictures, karaoke, an Al-Anon Skit, Al-Anon films from the WSO such as *Lois W. & the Pioneers* and *Lois' Story*, or a Serenity Walk following the end of the Banquet and speaker.

The 2025 New York North Area Fall Assembly will be held as Virtual, only on Zoom. Depending on what we decide to do for any extra programming, we may need a host district for a Virtual Ice Breaker or a Virtual Sunday Spiritual Panel.

If your District is considering hosting the 2025 Spring Convention, or a program for any of our Virtual Assemblies or Hosting the 2026 New York North Area Fall Election Assembly, please remember that you do not have to do it all alone. As Convention Coordinator, I have guidelines, past convention notes and other documents that I can share with you in addition to my own experience strength and hope and that of others who have worked on Conventions and Assemblies in the past. You are never alone in Al-Anon service.

Connection Nourishes Recovery

The topic of the December newsletter was "The Value of Connection." I am sure that most of us have heard the quote from John Milton that "no man is an island." We do not exist in a vacuum, and all of us need someone at some time in our recovery.

In the early days of my son's addiction, I was willing to isolate myself from my family and friends. I figured I would feel better if I could avoid the stares and questions that plagued me about what was going on with my son. If I was alone in my struggles, I would find the port in the storm where I could seek shelter and refuge in my loneliness and despair. Boy was I so wrong in every way!

When I entered the rooms of Al-Anon over thirteen years ago, I found acceptance, love, and support. I realized I did not have to go through this alone, and the value of connection to my friends and Al-Anon family made my recovery so much more worthwhile and long-lasting.

At our last Fall Assembly before COVID-19 shut us down, the icebreaker involved a ball of yarn. Each of us had to hold on to a string of yarn before passing it on to the next person in the circle. By the time we had reached everyone in the room, there was a web of yarn stretching across the entire group. The web of yarn represented the network that Al-Anon provides—threads of experience, strength, and hope that bind us together in our unity.

AMIAS Recertification Open; Due by 6/15/2024

If you are an AMIAS (Al-Anon Member Involved in Alateen Service), the window for recertifying has opened up.

Every year, each Area in the World Service Conference Structure is required to take part in the Annual Alateen Recertification process in order to continue to use the Alateen name. This is explained in the 2003 Alateen Motion from the Board of Trustees and the policy for Alateen. Both are found beginning on page 93 of the 2022-2025 Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual (P-24/27), v3.

The recertification process is twofold:

- To verify that every registered Alateen group has currently certified Al-Anon Members Involved in Alateen Service (AMIAS):
 - as Group Sponsor(s)
 - as the Current Mailing Address (CMA) for the Alateen group
 - as a Phone Contact for the public for the Alateen group
- 2. To verify the current certification of all AMIAS

We are requesting that all Areas complete the Alateen recertification by **June 15**, **2024**! This allows the World Service Office to verify that the Area recertification is complete by June 30.

Contact your Area Alateen Coordinator, Area Alateen Process Person amias@nynafg.com or District Representative to verify the process in your Area. Don't miss out on this opportunity to share your recovery with teens and younger members!
