Activity Summary

- Our Public Outreach Coordinators have been doing a wonderful job sending out Al-Anon information to local schools and physicians. They are welcoming to other Al-Anon members who would like to help make initial phone calls to these community contacts.
- Two new names and numbers have been added to the phone service call list
- WNY AIS Meetings have continued exclusively via Zoom (no meeting in July or August), with increased attendance, particularly from meetings & districts that are further from the in-person meeting location.
