Meeting List Publishing

In its role as the clearinghouse, the World Service Office supports service arms to encourage unity and common understanding.

In Tradition Nine, we learn of the ability and responsibility of groups and service arms to create committees and perform services to meet the needs of the fellowship. The decision to implement and support any service arm is within the autonomy of the groups being served, except in matters affecting another group, or Al-Anon, or A.A. as a whole.

In keeping with the Traditions and Warranties Four and Five of Concept Twelve (see "Concept Twelve" in "Al-Anon's Twelve Concepts of Service"), an Area may request that the WSO not publish

information about a meeting if the Area has a Meeting List Publishing Policy in place that the WSO has reviewed and agrees to support.

Area Discussion

NY North does not currently have a Meeting List Publishing Policy

To be clear... the WSO does not approve or disapprove Area policies. It agrees to support policies if they are aligned with the Traditions.

A consideration for discussion for the Fall Assembly - When does a group's practices effect other groups and/or Al-Anon as a whole? How can we foster better understanding with such groups and encourage them to practice the principles embodied in The Legacies? Do we want to create an Area Meeting List Publishing Policy?

Choosing a Group Name Policy

Choosing a Group Name Policy

The WSO registers new groups

The WSO was seeing an increase in the number of groups that were registering names that the WSO needed to have reviewed by committee. The WSO asked the Policy committee for guidance with the policy "Choosing a Group Name". There was a Thought Force and then a Task Force and the Policy Committee recommended a change in the wording of the policy.

The 2024 WSC passed the recommended changes to the wording of the "Choosing a Group Name" policy. The wording referenced more specifically the principles of the program.

The Implementation

The WSO staff have the responsibility and authority to implement the decisions of the World Service Conference.

- WSO will register new groups and update existing group names only when their name does not contain community-identifying designations.
- Guide groups who currently have names containing community-identifying designations to consider removing the designations from their names and using the "participants/attendees" field for community identification. Practice "obedience to the unenforceable".

The 2025 WSC Motion

Motion #7

Allow group names to continue to include identifiers such as those currently listed on page 28 of the 2022-2025 Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual (P24/27) v4(a) including "men, women, parents, adult children, young adults, other gender identification/sexual orientation, etc. with the understanding that in keeping with Traditions Three and Five, the groups will welcome anyone affected by someone else's drinking until the 2026 World Service Conference to allow WSC Structure Areas to discuss the implementation of the 2024 WSC-approved "Choosing a Group's Name" Policy.

Next Steps

The goal of the motion is to provide Conference members the opportunity to bring the discussion to their respective Areas to explore concerns, thoughts and opinions on the Policy and its implementation through spiritual conversations with the groups.

As the Policy Committee Chairperson, I want to reinforce that it was never the Policy Committee's intention to one day direct the WSO Staff to enforce this Policy on existing groups – EVER!

Area Discussion

If this is a concern, especially for those groups who have one of the identifiers in their name, groups are encouraged to have a group conscience discussion to allow members to have a voice in this matter. GRs can then share their group's perspective at the Fall Assembly.


How are the roles different?

Only the application process is different.

The Application Process



Applications are submitted to WSO (online process)

Regional Trustee applications are sent to the Area Delegate to be approved by the Area

Areas can submit one Regional Trustee application

Regional Trustee applications must be submitted by August 15th

The extra steps of being approved by the Areas add time and stress into the process for Regional Trustee Applicants over the Trustee at Large Applicants

Many Areas do not have a process in place to approve Regional Trustee Applications

The Problem


The Board of Trustees has 5 out of 18 positions that are vacant

Board operating at 72% capacity

Leadership needed for technology expansion, increasing legal threats, evolving cultural awareness and cybersecurity concerns

More demands falling on fewer people.

Proposed Solutions

A Task Force was formed charged with defining a single process for selecting Trustees modeled on the current Trustee at Large process that could be considered by and discussed with Conference members at the 2025 WSC.


Three different options were presented for consideration.

More time to consider the options - 2026 WSC

All Al-Anon members interested in applying to serve as Trustee begin the application process at al-anon.org

Regional Trustee applicants must submit in time to complete the Area approval process. (May need to submit up to one year in advance of August 15 deadline.)

Trustee At Large applicants need to submit by August 15.
