A Trusted Servant Passes

It is with great sadness that I am reporting the death of one of New York North's longest serving Al-Anon members, Louise F., from East Syracuse, New York. Louise was a member of Al-Anon for 60 years, attending her first Al-Anon meeting in July of 1965. At that time in Syracuse, the Al-Anon meetings were held in various members' homes.

In the early 1970's Louise became active in the local Syracuse Al-Anon Intergroup. When District 18 was formed, Louise became the first District Rep. She helped start the Eastwood Thursday Al-Anon Group, which celebrated their 50th Anniversary on July 11, 2024. Louise was very involved with the Syracuse Al-Anon Information Service (AIS) and served as Treasurer and then Secretary. She also served as the Service Center Coordinator and initiated the Syracuse AIS Al-Anon Archives in 1987, procuring many of the documents that we currently hold.

Louise served in all four of our District 18 Service Positions: District Representative, Alternate DR, Secretary, and Treasurer, some of these multiple times. She was active in planning our semi-annual District 18 Days of Sharing as well as our Annual Picnic. She loved being around other Al-Anon members. She chaperoned NYNAC in 1995 and 1998.

In 1986, Louise volunteered to serve on the committee planning the 1987 New York North Area Fall Election Assembly. Louise worked on every Election Assembly since then through 2017 (the last Election Assembly held in person until 2023, due to COVID).

On the New York North Area level, Louise was elected in 1987 as the Archivist, the first of several Area positions that she served in: NYN Secretary from 1991 to 1993; Chairperson from 1994 to 1996; Archivist again from 1997 to 1999; Treasurer from 2003 to 2005. At the 2008 Fall Election Assembly, Louise was elected again to serve as the NYN Treasurer until 2011. Louise also served on several Area Committees including the 1990 Committee for New York North to pursue incorporation, and the 1999 committee to revise the New York North Policy Document.

On a more personal level, Louise was my first Al-Anon Service Sponsor and a good friend. Our conversations on the phone and in person covered many topics, including Al-Anon, her family, and of course, SU Basketball.

I already miss her and I offer my sincere condolences to her family. I pray that she is at peace and is now reunited with her late husband Frank.
